Curriculum

Hawaii Technology Academy provides a comprehensive curriculum aligned to the Hawaii State Standards and the National Common Core State Standards.

Teacher-created lessons as well as Pearson Connexus online courses are used to provide a well-rounded academic experience for students. Advanced Placement as well as Dual Credit courses are offered to students looking for opportunities to earn college credit while in high school. Grades earned for these courses are weighted.

High School Graduation Requirements

In order to prepare students for a rigorous post-secondary education, HTA students meet entrance requirements for institutions of higher education by completing a course of study that meets or exceeds the state of Hawaii's graduation academic standards. HTA's block schedule allows students to take more classes and earn additional credits beyond the minimum required by the state of Hawaii. High school students are required to earn at least 24 credits towards graduation in the following areas:

4 Credits of English (English 9, English 10 and Expository Writing required)

3 Credits of Math (Algebra 1, Geometry and (1) other math elective required)

3 Credits of Science (Biology and (2) other lab Sciences required)

4 Credits of Social Studies (US History, World History, Participation in Democracy and Modern History of Hawaii required)

2 Concentration Credits (Foreign Language/Fine Arts/CTE courses)

1 Credit of Physical Education

.5 Credit of Health

6.5 Elective Credits

24 Credits total
